Board of Trustees



Meetings in Arizona

Each meeting in the state of Arizona elects one person to serve as Intergroup Representative. This person attends the monthly Intergroup meeting to bring their experience, strength, and hope to other Arizona meetings, and also receive support, information, and resources for their home group.

Standing Committees

Committees are formed for the purpose of achieving specific ongoing tasks.

Intergroup History: Intergroup is building a repository of documents and literature dating as far back as 1985, giving us a glimpse of the history of ACA in Arizona.

Public Information & Outreach: Trusted servants work to introduce ACA to the community through social media, our website, expo events, and visits to medical offices, shelters and related local businesses.

Hospitals & Institutions: Intergroup supports ACA meetings held in treatment centers, jails, prisons or other facilities that house adult children.

Workshops: Intergroup brings interactive, participatory workshops to the fellowship in Arizona, both in person and on Zoom, to spread the message of recovery to anyone who wants it.

Social Activities: Intergroup sponsors activities hosted by meetings throughout the state. These include game nights, picnics, and even a trip to a petting zoo for your Inner Child.

Executive Board

Service positions include: Chairperson, Vice-Chair, Secretary and Treasurer, in addition to the members who chair the standing committees.

WSO - World Service Organization

Created by the Fellowship in 1991, WSO supports the volunteer service structure of ACA by operating the day-to-day business of the organization.

ABC - Annual Business Conference

Held in April, the conference is an opportunity for the ACA Fellowship to discuss and vote on fellowship business. ABC delegates are selected by meetings, groups, intergroups, and regions.

Board of Trustees

Elected from among the Fellowship, Trustees are fellow travelers who express a profound faith in the ACA recovery program and are committed to upholding the Twelve Traditions and Twelve Concepts of ACA. In accordance with Tradition Two, the Board may act for the service of ACA; it does not govern.

Executive Committee

The EC consists of the four Corporate Officers: Chairperson, Vice Chairperson, Secretary, and Treasurer.

Business Operations

Collaborates and coordinates all business, operations and publishing aspects of WSO.

Policy and Structure

Develops policies and procedures of WSO, as well as archival efforts.

Fellowship & Public Engagement

Directs Fellowship/Public interactions, needs assessment, coordination and collaboration throughout the service structure.

Content Development

Manages the development, evaluation, and revision of content created by WSO.
